

## Field Trip 1 - November 2013

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This LEARNZ **Memorial Park 1** virtual field trip begins with [Prepare Students](#) [1] which gets your class ready for the field trip. Teachers, look for your section on the left-side menu of this site called [Teacher Support](#) [2].

This Field Trip 1 experience is made up of a number of components from **Tuesday 19 November to Thursday 21 November 2013**.

### Field Trip 1 Plan - November 2013

Monday 18 November	Travel Day. <b>Read</b> the first <a href="#">diary</a> [3] as Shelley and the ambassadors travel to the capital city to begin the <b>Memorial Park</b> field trip. <b>Read</b> about what the <a href="#">ambassadors</a> [4] did in their updates and <b>view</b> the <a href="#">panoramas</a> [5].
Tuesday 19 November	<b>Read</b> the <a href="#">diary</a> [6] about the history of the Mount Cook/Pukeahu area and <b>view</b> the <a href="#">panoramas</a> [5]. <b>Watch</b> the <a href="#">videos</a> [7] and climb the Carillon Tower to get a bird's eye view of the construction site. <b>Read</b> about what the <a href="#">ambassadors</a> [4] got up to today, <b>get</b> the questions and <b>listen</b> to the <a href="#">audioconferences</a> [8]. [8]
Wednesday 20 November	Take a closer look at how the underpass has been designed and <b>read</b> the <a href="#">diary</a> [9] about some of the construction challenges. <b>Watch</b> the <a href="#">videos</a> [7] from inside the trench. <b>Get</b> the questions and <b>listen</b> to the <a href="#">audioconferences</a> [8]. Jump aboard a digger, <b>read</b> the <a href="#">ambassador updates</a> [4] and <b>view</b> the <a href="#">panoramas</a> [5].
Thursday 21 November	Venture back into the Buckle Street trench. <b>Read</b> the <a href="#">diary</a> [10] to find out how stormwater and groundwater are managed on site. Visit a local school and <b>watch</b> the <a href="#">videos</a> [7] on water management and what locals think of the Memorial Park Project. <b>Read</b> the <a href="#">ambassador updates</a> [4] and <b>view</b> the <a href="#">panoramas</a> [5]. <b>Get</b> the questions and <b>listen</b> to the <a href="#">audioconferences</a> [8].

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All components in the table below are updated daily during the field trip. They remain on this website and can be used after the date of the live field trip.

<a href="#">Ambassadors</a> [11]	Classes can send an ambassador (small toy) on the field trip with the LEARNZ Field Trip teacher. Daily ambassador updates can be read by all enrolled classes.
<a href="#">Ask-an-Expert</a> [12]	Students can post their own questions on a Web Board to be answered by the field trip experts. For this special series of field trips from late 2013 until early 2015 Ask-an-Expert <b>will be kept open</b> , apart from school holidays. Once it has closed, the Ask-an-Expert link will go to a new page which has a selection of questions and answers from the field trip Web Board.
<a href="#">Audioconferences</a> [13]	Students put questions live to experts who are on location during the field trip. Audioconferences can also be listened to live via the Internet audiostream or from a recording.
<a href="#">Diaries</a> [14]	Shelley the LEARNZ Field Trip Teacher writes a detailed diary for students to read, accompanied by 10 captioned images for each day of the field trip - including the travel day on Monday.
<a href="#">Experts and Careers</a> [15]	Students meet each expert involved in this field trip via a profile page and short video. Potential career and training paths can also be explored on these pages.
<a href="#">Panoramas</a> [16]	Wide format images that help students familiarise themselves with the location of the field trip. Captions containing questions generate focus and inquiry.
<a href="#">Photo Gallery</a> [17]	All website and field trip photos are available in one easy-to-use location, where students can browse and select to further their interest and learning.
<a href="#">Videos</a> [18]	Short, curriculum-rich videos with questions and answers are made on each day of the field trip and uploaded in the evening for viewing the following day.
